Changing table is available in the Nursery.


Unisex/family restrooms are accessible from the narthex, to the left as you exit the sanctuary.

SLEEPER, AWAKE
40 days of companionship for the
deconstruction process

We at Allendale have chosen the Lenten season this year to deconstruct our faith. We are using as a foundation for this practice the devotional written by Suzanne DeWitt Hall called "Sleeper, Awake 40 days of companionship for the deconstruction process" The Path of Unlearning: Book One. These first two Sundays of Lent we will be focusing on the first section of the devotional devoted to Deconstruction Basics.

DECONSTRUCTION can mean many things. The Miriam Webster dictionary definition that DeWitt Hall references is:

"The analytic examination of something (such as a theory) often in order to reveal its inadequacy."

DeWitt Hall additionally writes that "Christian deconstruction is a process of questioning what was previously unquestioned and grappling with the implications of what's revealed as elements are stripped away."

In academia, deconstruction is a specific term referring to a way of analyzing texts, looking at relationships between words, and the inherent instability of their meanings.

Deconstruction broadly means breaking down, taking apart, examining, questioning, deciding which parts are broken or no longer serve us, and then keeping what's valuable and true. It can be painful and hard, but also rewarding and transformational, often leaving oneself with a joyful sense of renewed purpose.
