# WITNESS

## THE BOOK OF THE PROPHET HABAKKUK:

Habakkuk lived during the final decades of Israel's southern kingdom during a time of injustice and idolatry. All of his words are addressed personally to God, and the book tells about Habakkuk's personal struggle, his journey of trying to believe that God is good when there is so much evil and tragedy in the world.

Habakkuk's words are actually poems of lament, very similar to the laments you find in the book of Psalms. The poet lodges a complaint and then draws God's attention to suffering or injustice in the world, demanding that God do something

and knowing about this lament form is actually the key to understanding the design and message of this short book.

Chapters 1 and 2 are framed as a back and forth argument between Habakkuk and God and the prophet lodges 2 complaints to which God offers 2 responses. His first complaint is that life in Israel has become horrible. Habakkuk is crying out asking God to do something but nothing seems to change...

Habakkuk depicts himself as a watchman on the city walls, waiting for God's response, which eventually comes. God gives him a vision about an appointed time in the future. God says that the righteous person will live by their faith in this hope and vision.

In a poem near the end of the book, the exodus story of the past has become an image of the future exodus God will perform. God will once again defeat evil and bring down the Pharaohs and the Babylons of this world. God will bring justice to all people and rescue the oppressed and the innocent.

And it's this hope that enables Habakkuk to conclude the book with hopeful praise

that even if the world's falling apart with food shortage or drought or war or whatever he will choose trust and joy in the covenant promises of God.

HABAKKUK 1:1-4; 2:1-4 Nope. Not good enough, God.

This is the prophet Habakkuk's initial response when God answers the prophet's urgent cry for help.

And yet, by the end of this short book, Habakkuk is literally singing God's praises. What happened? What changed? And do we accept God's vague answer as sufficient?

Maybe what changes for Habakkuk is the intimacy that comes from generative conflict. It does seem that God not only welcomes the prophet's critical feedback, but affirms their perception that there is something wrong - that the spirit of the proud "is not right within them."

Or maybe it's the reminder that there is a vision, even if it isn't spelled out in this passage. Maybe God has reminded the prophet of what they already know, deep inside them, the vision they already carry that comes from their ancestors and is written into their DNA.
