

WITNESS

A BRIEF THEOLOGY OF HALLOWEEN

The name itself comes from "All Hallows' Eve," of course, a carnival-like inversion celebrating the shadow side of life — ghosts and ghouls and such — just before the great festival celebrating the saints. Its deep roots may well include folk traditions of honoring the dead, appeasing evil spirits, and marking the end of the summer harvest and the beginning (in the Northern hemisphere, at least!) of the darkest days of the year.

But whatever it's origins, Halloween today is worth thinking about. It's become one of the most popular holidays in North America (second only to Christmas!), and at its best, it's a magical, playful night of community-building and neighborhood-making.

It's easy to grumble about "all that sugar," "marauding teenagers," "a waste of time," and so forth. But think of it: when else do we intentionally spend this kind of time together as a community? When else do we do something as a neighborhood that's this intergenerational? This playful, goofy, and plain old fun?

And there's an even deeper side to all of this, too: in many neighborhoods, lines of social division — segregated lines of race and class, for example — are often crossed on Halloween night. In such moments, Halloween can become an all-too-brief time of sharing experiences and resources, catching sight of a true "commonwealth" too often obscured from view on the other 364 nights of the year.

And after all, what better way to honor the dead, prepare to celebrate the saints, and enter together the darkest time of the year than to embody — with equal parts creativity and joy — the "loving our neighbors as ourselves" to which Jesus calls us every day?

LUKE 19:1-10

The story of Zaccheus, alongside other Lucan accounts of the rich and powerful, is unflinching about God's judgment on systems of economic disparity and those who profit from them. The twist is the good news that justice and reparations are not only imperative for the poor, but that repentance and restoration are available to the privileged.

Jesus proclaims, "today salvation has come to this house." It is unlikely that Jesus would have gone to Zaccheus' home alone, but would have been flanked by his motley crew of disciples, themselves victims of the system Zaccheus enforced.

Perhaps it's not over a quiet dinner alone with Jesus that Zaccheus has a change of heart and offers repayment and reparations for what he has stolen. More likely, it is when he looks at the broken faces and bodies of those crowded into his home that he is confronted with the harm he has caused.
