Unisex/family restrooms are accessible from the narthex, to the left as you exit the sanctuary.


The balcony is open for those wishing to have more social distancing.

WITNESS

HARM BEING DONE BY THE STATE:

Two bills currently moving through the state legislature will target undocumented folks, making it illegal for individuals to house them or give them a ride to the doctor in their car. It also makes it dangerous for them to seek medical help and obtain identification.

Harmful Consequences of SB 1718 and HB 1617:

Denial of Identification: Both bills prohibit local governments from funding organizations that issue identification documents to undocumented individuals. Without proper identification, these individuals may face difficulty accessing essential services, proving their identity in various situations, and even exercising their human rights.

Reduced Access to Healthcare: The bills require hospitals to collect patient immigration status information, which may deter undocumented individuals from seeking medical help due to fear of deportation.

Barriers to Employment: The bills impose harsher penalties for employers who hire undocumented workers and mandate the use of E-Verify. These measures will further limit workers' ability to support themselves and their families.

Criminalizing Assistance: This provision will make it increasingly difficult for undocumented individuals to access essential services like healthcare, education, and legal assistance. Not only will this affect undocumented individuals, but also those who wish to help them. Individuals, community organizations, and faith-based groups could face severe legal consequences for providing transportation or hoursing assistance out of compassion or a sense of moral responsibility.

As a faith community seeking justice and liberation, we are called to stand up for what is right and resist evil and injustice in any forms they present themselves, including harmful legislation. We believe that the passage of SB 1718 and HB 1617 would further marginalize our immigrant neighbors, and as such, we cannot remain silent.
