

WITNESS

IMMIGRANTS ARE FLEEING:

As the imminent Florida anti-immigration law gears up for its July 1st enforcement, a wave of fear and uncertainty has gripped immigrant communities. Rep. Rick Roth admitted that the bill, passed by Florida Republicans, including himself, was designed to "scare migrants," but the lawmakers did not anticipate the distress it would cause among longstanding immigrant residents.

The legislation, state Senate Bill 1718, introduces various intimidating provisions such as mandatory E-Verify checks for businesses with more than 25 employees, limited social services for undocumented immigrants, and a human smuggling felony for bringing an immigrant not "inspected" by authorities into the state. This latter provision is particularly unsettling for mixed-status families who travel across state lines.

However, Roth and several of his Republican colleagues are now trying to assuage the fears of the immigrant communities. During a faith-based event, Roth was recorded advising the attendees not to leave the state, reassuring them that the law is not as draconian as it might appear. He emphasized that the law is filled with "loopholes" and is more political posturing than enforceable policy, with no included funding for its enforcement.

Despite these assurances, the silence from representatives about what laid-off undocumented workers might do and the ambiguity around the potential felony charges for mixed-status families travelling together continue to deepen the immigrants' anxieties.

The bill has indeed achieved its purported objective – to scare – leaving many immigrant families on edge, feeling marginalized and intimidated.

GENESIS 12:1-9

Did somebody ever try to "bless" you with something you didn't ask for, and you feel compelled to muster appreciation for this "gift"? The infamous bunny onesie scene from "A Christmas Story" comes to mind

Abram's story in Genesis shows this, with divine interventions infringing self-determination. Often, these "blessings" ignore the exploited, with Abram's dream being a nightmare for the vulnerable. The narrative dismisses the cost of land seizure, overlooking the disadvantaged.

Highways metaphorically symbolize these exploitative "blessings", functioning as physical representations of capitalist expansion and systemic damage to marginalized communities. Our theology must reconsider "blessings", divorcing them from transgressions, struggle, and scarcity to prevent injustices against our kin and Earth.
