## WITNESS

Happy Pride.

This year, especially, the adjective "Happy" feels trite. Strange. Insufficient. Offbeat. Certainly, for years, Queer and Trans people have been pointing out the insufficiency of Rainbow Capitalism and Pinkwashing.

We are in a landmark year (doesn't it feel like every year is landmark?) as it relates to policies directly impacting queer and trans people.

New laws allow teachers to "snitch" on students who use pronouns differing from the ones they use at home.

New laws ban books that accurately and creatively depict the lives of Black people, immigrants, LGBTQ+ people, and so many other marginalized people.

New laws ban gender-affirming care. We've seen at least three of our own families here at Allendale recently relocate to other states in part due to these anti-trans policies.

You may feel we are in the wilderness. Even more, this may feel like Hell.

What is wilderness? Throughout the Bible it is described to mean "pasture, uninhabited land." It is used in various contexts, including Hagar's banishment, the movement of the Hebrews out of Egypt, and the place where Moses heard from God. We learn that the people kept the Passover "even in the wilderness" in Numbers 9:5. Though the wilderness describes an "uninhabited" and unfamiliar land, God is nearby. God meets the people in the wilderness. God is with us.

Our struggle in the wilderness is both a religious and secular trial, a challenge to our communities to shape quality of life amidst adversity. The fight for equality and acceptance, our collective stand against oppression, makes this Pride even more important and meaningful.

Happy Pride indeed.

## GENESIS 21:8-21

For progressive Christians who want to believe the Bible is a book of justice or love, this story is disorienting.

When we come to stories in the text that offend our sensibilities, we are left with a few choices. Do we try to explain it away, do we throw out the story, or do we ignore it? Perhaps there may be other options beyond these obvious ones.

It is difficult to encounter these stories. And as challenging as it may be, reading these texts requires an intentional posture of curiosity and critique. We must develop the skills of critical engagement in every text we read, but certainly for the Bible. If we do not have a critical lens in the texts that serve as our spiritual nourishment, we will allow toxic ideas to govern our lives.
