

### Why Do We Never See Bilhah and Zilpah?:

(Written by Temple Emanuel: a Jewish Community in Massachusetts)

The Jewish people are missing two of our mothers. We don't see them. We don't talk about them. We act as if they don't exist. We don't say their names.

Tomorrow morning, we will.

### Bilhah and Zilpah.

Here are the incontrovertible facts. They are the mothers of one third of our people. Bilhah is the mother of Dan and Naphtali. Zilpah is the mother of Gad and Asher.

Each had as many children as Rachel (Joseph and Benjamin). They are both the wives of Jacob. The Torah says so explicitly.

Yet.

Hardly any midrash mentions them.

When we bless our daughters, we say: "May you be like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah." We do not say their names.

In 1998, when Siddur Sim Shalom [a prayer book] added the matriarchs in the Amidah [a central prayer of the Jewish liturgy], it added: Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah. We do not say their names.

In 2016, when Siddur Lev Shalem [another prayer book] came out, that is only [seven] years ago, again: we do not say their names. Only Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah.

Why do we still not see the mothers of one third of our people? Maybe in biblical times, or ancient rabbinic times, it was a patriarchy.

But today?

GENESIS 37:1-4, 12-28

What do we do when our sacred scriptures depict our "Protector" placing some people under peril? How can we reconcile our belief in one who appears to stand by while we are thrust into jeopardy? In moments when we feel as though we're being engulfed by stormy seas, crying out for grace and finding none, how must we respond? It's time to face the understanding that neither God nor Her cosmos are obligated to grant us continuous comfort or even personal security. These natural laws might restore equilibrium, but they can also cause imbalances leading us to disaster. Can we not passionately cry out to God to treat us justly? Or is it time to seek wisdom from our spiritual predecessors, taking control through our own divine agency? The answers to these questions may challenge our faith, but it is a challenge we must meet, embracing the complex truths within our beliefs.
