Holy Communion is typically celebrated on the first Sunday of the month.


Masks are recommended while on campus at Allendale to protect the most vulnerable.

WITNESS

FROM "POVERTY, BY AMERICA" BY MATTHEW DESMOND:

Why all this American poverty? I've learned that this question requires a different approach. To understand the causes of poverty, we must look beyond the poor.

Those of us living lives of privilege and plenty must examine ourselves. Are we we the secure, the insured, the housed, the college educated, the protected, the lucky connected to all this needless suffering?

This book is my attempt to answer that question, addressed to that "we." Which makes this a book about poverty that is not just about the poor. Instead, it's a book about how the other half lives, about how some lives are made small so that others may grow.

Drawing on years of my own research and reporting, as well as studies from across the social sciences, I lay out why there is so much poverty in America and make a case for how to eliminate it.

Ending poverty will require new policies and renewed political movements, to be sure. But it will also require that each of us, in our own way, become poverty abolitionists, unwinding ourselves from our neighbors' deprivation and refusing to live as unwitting enemies of the poor.
