

Unisex/family restrooms are in the office hallway, accessible from the narthex, to the left as you exit the sanctuary.

The balcony is open for those wishing to have more social distancing.

These roles offer a path for those called to devote their lives to addressing the needs of marginalized communities. Deaconesses and home missioners are consecrated laypeople who serve in various ministries, focusing on social justice, healthcare, education, and advocacy.

Both deaconesses and home missioners undergo rigorous training, including theological education and practical ministry experience. This preparation equips them to serve effectively in diverse settings, whether in urban centers, rural communities, or beyond. Their commitment is lifelong, reflecting the seriousness of their call to service.

Deaconesses and home missioners are consecrated in a special ceremony, marking the start of their dedicated ministry. This act affirms their calling and emphasizes that their work is not just a job but a sacred vocation. Their ministries often place them at the forefront of the church's engagement with social justice, where they work to address systemic inequalities and support those in need.

In a world where many are suffering, the roles of deaconesses and home missioners are vital. They exemplify the United Methodist Church's commitment to living out the gospel through service, advocating for justice, and showing what it means to love and serve others as Christ did. Their work is a powerful reminder that faith is not just about belief but about action—serving others with compassion and dedication.
