

WITNESS

UPWARD!:

John Wesley in *Thoughts Upon Methodism*,
"I am not afraid that the people called
Methodists should ever cease to exist either in
Europe or America," he wrote in his Thoughts
Upon Methodism. "But I am afraid, lest they
should only exist as a dead sect, having the
form of religion without the power."

He was concerned that Methodists would lose their first love—namely, the love of God and others—and fall into the trap of religiosity. Likewise, the Wesleyan inheritance will always be open to interpretation. This is natural and to be expected. In our own time, in fact, Methodism is splintering into a number of alternative paths along the fault lines of biblical and cultural hermeneutics, and we grieve the way in which the term "Wesleyan" has been co-opted to represent perspectives that we find alien to the tradition. Another way to put this is to say that the divisions are being shaped by ways of being Christian that are not fundamentally Wesleyan.

The Wesleyan way that we have come to know and love is not literalistic in its approach to scripture; that feels more like resurgent fundamentalism. Methodists view the Bible as a dynamic, living document that draws us into God's love and shapes our living in our unique contexts. Our view of the Wesleyan heritage is not dogmatic in its theological orientation; that characteristic reflects a more Reformed way of doing theology. Methodists are "practical," not "confessional" theologians. From a Wesleyan perspective, the purpose of theology is eyeopening transformation, not blind conformity. The Wesleyan way is not congregationalist in its organization and structure; rather, it champions connection and unity-in-diversity in the Christian family. Some Methodists who claim the Wesleyan label as their exclusive possession have actually exchanged the spirit, vision, and orientation of the Wesleys, we believe, for other ways of approaching the Christian faith. - Excerpt from Upward!

MARK 1:16-20 & UPWARD!: PP. XIV-XV

In this passage, Jesus calls his first disciples, inviting them to leave their nets and follow him in a dynamic, lifechanging movement. This passage reminds us that faith is not about rigid structures or preserving traditions but about responding to the call of love, transformation, and community.

John Wesley similarly warned that Methodism could become a "dead sect," losing its spirit to inflexibility or dogma.

Our Wesleyan heritage values scripture as a living document and a theology that seeks transformation rather than conformity. As Methodists, we are called to a faith that is practical, compassionate, and rooted in love—just as those first disciples were called to leave behind the familiar and venture into the unknown with Jesus. The focus is on living out the heart of our tradition—letting it inspire us to act—engaging authentically and courageously with love and justice in our unique contexts today.
