WITNESS

UPWARD!:

So what does wisdom look like for those who seek to understand and live their faith through a Wesleyan lens? We address this critical question in this first movement through four conversations.

- First, the way of wisdom is founded upon the platform of grace. The Wesleys oriented their whole vision of life in Christ around the concept of grace. Every aspect of their theology reflects some facet of God's grace, particularly as we find it embodied in Jesus.
- Second, the Wesleys emphasized the importance of a person's posture in life. How we position ourselves in relation to others demonstrates how we seek to imitate Christ. If we really want to follow Jesus, then we will assume the posture of humility.
- Third, one of the most important debates in our world today revolves around the issue of inclusivity. In the Gospels, time and time again, Jesus transforms exclusivists into people with a wide embrace. His own life bears witness to the practice of inclusivity.
- Fourth, the promise of love. John and Charles Wesley made a special point to draw an intimate connection between grace and love. Charles, the poet of "love divine," put the promise of love at the center of life in Christ.

We invite you, then, into these four important conversations about the way of wisdom. Each theme strikes at the heart of what it means to be Wesleyan. Even more importantly, they point to the spiritual wisdom of Jesus. Methodists have inherited a legacy rooted in grace, humility, inclusivity, and love. - Excerpt from <u>Upward!</u>

PSALM 51:10-12 & UPWARD!: PP. 5-6

In this passage, the psalmist cries out for a pure heart, a steadfast spirit, and the joy of salvation. This longing reflects the wisdom we seek through a Wesleyan lens, which begins with grace—a gift freely given, shaping every part of our lives. Humility is the posture we adopt as we relate to others, mirroring Jesus' own self-giving love.

Inclusivity follows naturally; Jesus repeatedly widened the circle to embrace those on the margins. And finally, love is the binding promise, the ultimate expression of grace in action. Together, these four themes—grace, humility, inclusivity, and love—offer a framework for a life of wisdom that mirrors the heart of Christ.
