

WITNESS

THE PERICHORESIS:



The Perichoresis, represented in this stitched artwork with trans colors by Honey Goudard, is a powerful expression of the relationship between God the Creator, Redeemer, Sustainer. In Christian theology, Perichoresis refers to the intimate, interdependent relationship within the Trinity. The term itself comes from the Greek word for "rotation" or "interpenetration," signifying how the three persons of the triune God mutually indwell and share in one another's life. This concept highlights the dynamic unity and co-equal nature of the Trinity, while still respecting the distinctiveness of each person.

This imagery speaks to the inclusivity that is central to the mission of Allendale UMC. The choice to depict this sacred dance of relationship in trans colors affirms the inherent dignity, worth, and inclusion of transgender people within the divine image.

Just as the persons of the Trinity exist in perfect harmony and communion, all people, including those who identify as transgender, are welcomed into the divine embrace and the full life of the Church. It is a reminder that in God's kindom, there are no barriers—only love, inclusion, and shared belonging.

MATTHEW25:35-36,40B&UPWARD!:PP.109-110

In this passage, Jesus challenges us to see him in the most marginalized—those who are hungry, thirsty, strangers, or imprisoned. This passage underscores a fundamental Methodist conviction: living out our faith through acts of mercy and justice. The text from Upward! also resonates with this by reiterating the Wesleyan call to serve our present age, emphasizing a life that mirrors the prophetic and holistic nature of the Wesley brothers' teachings. Just as John Wesley envisioned Methodists as gospelbearers in a global parish, today we are called to be active participants in God's mission, embodying justice, peace, and love. This involvement means not only recognizing the divine in every person but also committing to transformative action that bridges divides and fosters the kindom of God on Earth. Thus, living the Wesleyan way today involves embracing our roles as bearers of the gospel, advocates for justice, and seekers of shalom in a complex and divided world.
