

WITNESS

CANDLE OF PEACE, HOPE, AND JUSTICE:

During apartheid in South Africa, Johannesburg's Central Methodist Mission created a candle encircled in barbed wire, inspired by Amnesty International's symbol. They called it the Candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice. Each week, they lit the candle during worship, naming those harassed, imprisoned, or killed for resisting racial injustice. As they read John 1:5—"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it"—they rededicated themselves to justice. Their actions led the government to ban their services from radio and TV.

Today, we continue our new ritual of lighting a Candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice at the start of worship, joining 25 congregations across the country in prayer for those suffering under our government's barbedwire policies—knowing that you cannot have peace and hope without justice.

This Sunday, we light the candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice for federal workers—for those whose jobs have been eliminated through an agency or bureau being unlawfully closed, those who have been told not to return to work after recently moving to the nation's capital to begin what was considered a solid job, those who have been purged from the payroll as an act of revenge or retaliation, those who feel a wave of anxiety envelop them every time an email comes with the words "fork in the road," and those who are struggling to maintain hope when the ground beneath them seems to shift each day.

We light this candle proclaiming that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never overcome the light. May Jesus strengthen us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

LUKE 6:27-38

There is an unexpected way about The Gospel. People aren't in the places you think they should be. The inheritance doesn't go to the people it usually does.
