### **WITNESS**

#### **CANDLE OF PEACE, HOPE, AND JUSTICE:**

During apartheid in South Africa, Johannesburg's Central Methodist Mission created a candle encircled in barbed wire, inspired by Amnesty International's symbol. They called it the Candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice. Each week, they lit the candle during worship, naming those harassed, imprisoned, or killed for resisting racial injustice. As they read John 1:5—"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it"—they rededicated themselves to justice. In a spirit of solidarity, more than 40 Justice-Seeking congregations around the country are lighting similar candles as new barbed-wire policies unfold.

This Sunday we light the Candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice for all who continue to suffer in Ukraine, the largest conflict in Europe since World War II. We pray for Ukrainians who have had to grow accustomed to the death and disruptions that war brings yet still must find a way to get up and live their lives each day. For Russians who have found the courage to risk their own freedom to protest their government's aggression. Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." May those in leadership—President Zelensky, President Putin, President Trump, and leaders throughout the European Union—seek to be children of God by understanding how peace is brought about: not through intimidation or coercion, but when we can recognize the humanity in one another.

We light this candle proclaiming that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never overcome the light. May Jesus strengthen us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.
